We are a small fellowship of believers. A number of us come from non-Christian backgrounds, desirous of family members to become Christian. Yet, by God's grace we are thankful and growing in Christ. Some of us face protracted spiritual attacks. There are also anxious souls among us, yet we are learning to live as a hospitable family of believers under caring leaders. There's three of us who shepherd: pastor, elder and deacon. We are grateful for the years of support, encouragement through you and from our sending church, the Covenant Christian Church of Wyoming. Currently discussions are in place about moving toward independence, though we will continue to be a needy congregation, relying on financial support.

One gentleman, who came to Christ out of Sikhism quite a few years ago, is looking forward to become a member. He's the father of a member family who joined us eighteen months ago. A few others, who are not baptized, come for Bible study. One is a young Sikh father. Two others are in their young twenties, sons from a family who recently turned to Christ. They are from the same church in India, a younger member from our church comes. It is a joy to see them and others 'drinking' in the Word and to come back again and again to the centrality of the gospel, the death and resurrection of Christ. In Christ the old passes away, behold, the new has come!



Sunday Fellowship Gathering

The place we meet for worship is on a busy intersection, in a large residential neighborhood. No church building exists in a three-kilometer radius. Half a kilometer north of the church, stands a 55-foot statue, the god Hanuman, and a 54-foot Shiv at a Hindu temple directly behind us. Neighboring stores sell religious wares, gods, iconostasis and other religious paraphernalia. The darkness is heavy. So are the chains. They need the light of the gospel. Our prayer is that the gospel of Jesus Christ may set many free from the bondage of sin, fear and superstitions.

Our congregation hosts a community event in the spring, fall and Christmas Eve. In warmer weather, we set up a table outdoors. People can pick up a Bible and ask questions. They leave with a pen, a phone number, and words of gospel invitation.

Finally, we have been actively pursuing Mukesh Kumar from India to serve alongside with a view to calling him as pastor. Mukesh is a graduate from the Reformed Seminary (GKSA) in South Africa. His immigration is pending, still 'in process.' We appreciate your prayers for us and for him, that the Lord's will may be done.

Rev. Bout will join me on this trip. Please pray for God's guidance and provision.
